Volunteers play a vital role in WoodGreen's Income Tax Clinic

Each year, approximately 100 volunteers with WoodGreen's Income Tax Clinic helps Toronto residents living on low incomes to file simple tax returns. The clinic is Toronto's largest year-round free income tax clinic (can assist people with up to 10 years of back taxes—and volunteers play a vital role in its successful operation. This past season, the clinic helped to complete more than 2,200 tax returns.

Volunteers who work in WoodGreen's Income Tax Clinic do multiple jobs, not only in support of clients but also each other. This interconnected process requires precise teamwork from several different types of volunteers. Administrative volunteers help book appointments and are first point of contact for clients. Next, tax prep volunteers help complete all tax returns. Throughout, tax lead volunteers support the tax prep volunteers, plus assist with running the clinic.

The result? Overall the response to tax clinic has been positive. Clients feel grateful for the support; their tax returns have been filed, and they can put aside any worries. Priceless peace of mind made possible at no cost, thanks to the work and dedication of volunteers.



WoodGreen Volunteers attended a workshop in 2SLGBTQ+


WoodGreen Volunteers attended a workshop about the2SLGBTQ+ community. The workshop was organized by WoodGreen's Volunteer and Student Services and was facilitated by guest speaker Waem Charafeddine, who is a co-founder of Beyond Toronto Life. This workshop had two sessions about the 2SLGBTQ+ and heterosexual communities and the complex intersectionality that exists between them.

Session one explored deeper into the complexity of cis and hetero normative aspects of current society and workplace, and how LGBTQ+ community is challenging this norm. It also covered components of human identity and gender expression and identity.



Session two explained different types of discrimination, systemic oppression, and racism within these communities, and the negative mental health effects that come from these social inequalities. Volunteers found the session extremely educational, and it enhanced their knowledge in identifying different gender types.
