ABOUT THE PROGRAM

- The Building Code Skills Development Program for Internationally Trained Individuals a skills-training initiative that prepares participants for the role of Building Official with the construction and public administration sectors. Participants will learn:
 - Building Code legislation and regulations
 - Principles of building science and how they affect the performance of various materials, construction types, building designs, and mechanical systems
 - Technical communication skills and electronic communication processes used by the construction industry
 - Reading and interpreting construction drawings and an understanding of how drawings must be prepared for building permit applications
- Program content has been created in collaboration with the Ontario Building Officials Association (OBOA) and George Brown College's Continuing Education Technology and Trades Department
- Most courses provide graduates with Continuing Education credits which may be transferable to post-secondary or Continuing Education construction and engineering technologies programs

THIS PROGRAM WILL PROVIDE YOU WITH

- Ontario Continuing Education credits
- Graduates will be eligible for the OBOA Building Code Qualified (BCQ) certification after completing this certificate and the Building Code Identification Number (BCIN) exams for House 2012 and General Legal/Process 2012
- Graduates will be eligible for a one-year student membership with the OBOA

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Interested applicants will be assessed for English and Math skills (Ontario Grade 12 or equivalent)
- Applicants must have a current resume and be able to demonstrate previous experience, interest and suitability to both training and employment within the municipalities and/or construction sectors
- Must be able to work in Ontario
- Permanent resident or Canadian citizen (Minimum CLB level 8)
- Must be able to commit to up to 20 weeks of academic and skills training
- Applicants must have access to a computer and internet
